Planning and Development Report

December 2024

1. Proposed Tremblay Multi-Use Connection (Terminal Avenue to Tremblay LRT Station). project has been put on pause until the time when VIA rail redevelops the area as part of the High Frequency Rail (HFR). No timetable yet.

The RPCA has subsequently contacted VIA's HFR team to ensure that community concerns are reflected in the redevelopment plan and to see more information on how the City's work to date might be incorporated into VIA's planning. HFR representatives wrote back in early December offering to set up a meeting in mid -January to discuss input. Date of meeting to be confirmed. Kris Nanda to attend

The City is looking at an interim solution by extending a Mult-Use Path (MUP) from Tremblay Road and along Riverside and up behind the Main Post Office and ending near the intersection of Sandford Fleming and Terminal Avenue. Staff will include this connection in the Transportation Master Plan (TMP) Update for consideration by Council when the TMP is brought forward in 2025. (Implementation of this project is subject to the City's priority list of active transportation projects and future capital budget priorities

- 2. According to the City of Ottawa Media Relations branch, "construction of the Smyth Road Cycling Safety Improvements project is near completion and it is anticipated that the cycling facility will be open by the end of the year except for intersection crossing at the former Riverside Hospital entrance Final paving, concrete reinstatements and landscaping work is planned for spring 2025.
- 3. City Staff response to Federation of Citizens Association (FCA) Comments on Draft 1 of New Zoning Bylaw for Ottawa The City responded to the FCA's detailed comment on December 6. A copy of the City response is attached separately (The RPCA is a member of the FCA)
